January and March show; February and
April are probably on the reverse sides.

inc. Columns of figures under headings; the
first feast recorded is that of the
Circumcision.

expl. Baltildis

leaf 2.

inc. Columns of figures under headings; for
17 March a s.XV^{ex} hand has inserted the
feast of St Patrick.

expl. matris sanctificari (the list includes
Saints Wulfstan and Chad).

Parchment, 150 x 97 mm (135 x 95 mm),
leaves are truncated at top and bottom and
are probably part of a larger manuscript,
possibly an astronomical or medical
manual; ruling is vertical, in ink; lines 3
mm apart. Ink very worn and faded and
illegible in places

Script A small gothic textura precissa, but
the greater part of both leaves is occupied
by numerical tables using arabic numerals.

Decoration One blue initial each on
leaves 1 and 2. Headings and entries in
alternating red and faded brown ink;
numbers also written in red and brown ink
alternately
