Contents: Part of the office of the Holy Cross, consisting of the stanzas of the hymn *Patris sapientia veritas divina* (The wisdom of the Father, and truth divine) recited at Sext, None and Vespers. For all hours, each stanza concludes with the same short verses: ‘Adoramus te domine ihesus. Deus in adiutorium [meum intende]’.

The transcription follows the layout of the single column of 14 lines, with hyphens added for words broken at the end of lines. Expanded scribal abbreviations are underlined, decorated initials are indicated in bold and rubrics in red.
