Isidore Bp. of Seuil, w<sup>h</sup> seems by the hand to be written in France, about the time of  
Charles the Great, but rather before than after; it appearing more ancient than a  
Copy of Bede on the Canonical Epistles in the Bodleian Library, which was  
A.D. 818, or before, & so must be near 900 years old.
